The site basics: dimensions, format, and scope

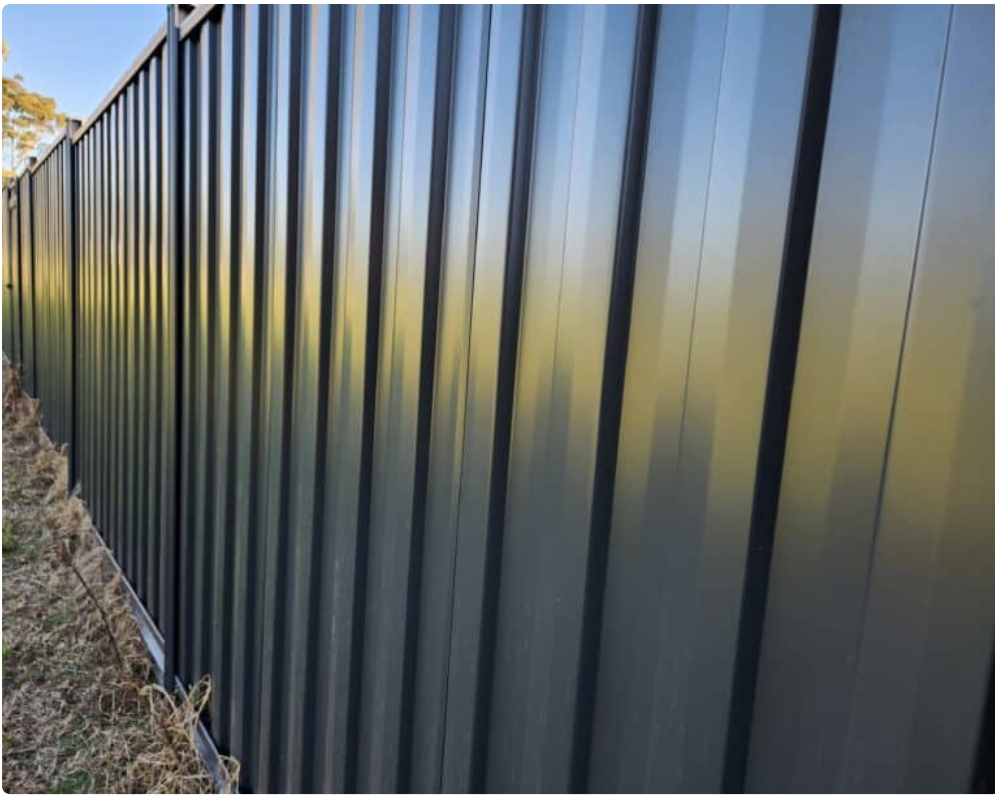
