4. **Discontinuation:** When Valve eliminates a case from active drop swimming pools or terminates a collection, the supply becomes finite, causing costs to rise as demand continues.
5. **Sticker labels and Souvenirs:** Tournament mementos and weapons decorated with rare, discontinued stickers (like Katowice 2014 holo stickers) can multiply a skin's baseline worth greatly.

The Holy Grails: Most Legendary Rare CS: GO Skins

1. AWP|Dragon Lore (Souvenir)

Undoubtedly the most famous skin in the video game, the Dragon Lore includes a mythical beast breathing fire across its body. While basic Factory New variations command massive sums, the **Souvenir Factory New Dragon Lore** from major tournaments (particularly signed by gamers like Tyler "Skaddoodle" Latham from Boston 2018) are ultra-rare.

- **Approximated Value:** £ 150,000+

2. StatTrak™ M4A4|Growl (Factory New)

The Howl is unique because it is the just "Contraband" quality product in the game. Shortly after its release in 2014, Valve discovered that the art work was plagiarized. Valve right away got rid of the case, changed the art work, and upgraded the existing M4 Howls to "Contraband" status, stopping any brand-new drops permanently.

- **Approximated Value:** £ 30,000 to £ 100,000+ (depending on stickers and wear)

3. AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 - "The Blue Gem")

While the Case Hardened surface is common, particular pattern design templates feature nearly 100% strong blue on the top magazine and receiver. Pattern index 661 in Factory New condition is extensively considered the supreme AK-47 skin.

- **Approximated Value:** Estimated to be worth upwards of £ 400,000 to £ 500,000 based upon current private collector offers.

4. Karambit|Case Hardened (Blue Gem - Pattern 387)

Similar to the AK-47, the Karambit Case Hardened with pattern index 387 includes an entirely blue playside. A pristine Factory New version of this knife is held by a single collector who notoriously turned down a EUR1.2 million offer.

- **Approximated Value:** Priceless/ Over £ 1,000,000
