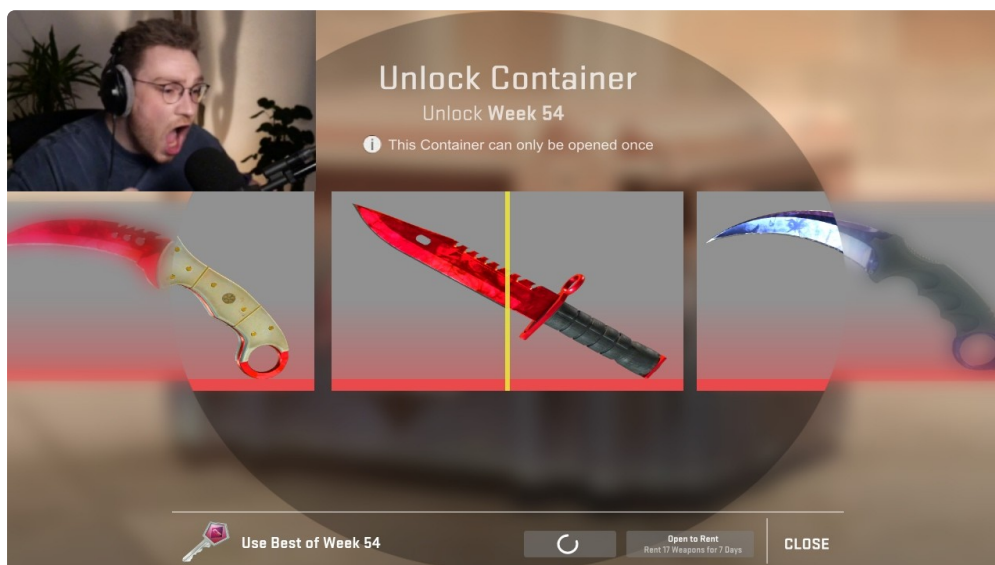
5 Tips for Responsible Case Opening
