

At AELO Swiss Academy, the "training trip" conversation begins with something very practical: what type of airline-minded path you desire, and what timing you're aiming for. AELO is a Swiss flight-training institution based in Locarno, in Ticino, operating in the Locarno Flight terminal area. It additionally runs at a site AELO inaugurated at Locarno Airport terminal, with a restored devoted garage and an investment reported as greater than CHF 3 million.

The training isn't mounted as a single straight line for everyone. Also from the method AELO provides its programs, you can see there are distinct routes. So just how does AELO pick a training journey for each pupil?
