Call, schedule, pay, wave farewell. The difference in between a smooth, fairly priced experience and a discouraging one appears in the details you vet before the truck shows up. Avoid companies that decline to provide a range and only expose a number after filling the truck. - Can you price this from pictures, and what's your variety by load size?
- What's consisted of in that rate, and what might make it change on-site?
- Are you insured with basic liability and workers' compensation, and can you email the certificate?

- What do you donate or recycle from a task like mine, and will I get a receipt if products are donated?
- Will you be able to complete this in one go to with the truck and crew you're sending?

If a company responds to these quickly and clearly, you're probably dealing with pros. If they dodge, stall, or make complex basic questions, relocation on.



## Getting your space all set: Prep that conserves time and money

Preparation doesn't suggest backbreaking labor. It implies removing friction, literally and figuratively. Clear sidewalks from the curb or driveway to the products.
