- **Appeal:** Simple rules and familiar mechanics attract casual and seasoned gamblers alike.

4. Prize/ Pot Games

- **How it works:** Multiple players deposit skins into a cumulative pot. Each skin contributes tickets based on its dollar value. A random draw selects a winner, where a higher overall contribution yields a higher statistical possibility of winning the entire pot.
- **Appeal:** The ultimate "high-roller" game mode, where single fortunate winners can stroll away with countless dollars in unusual digital items.

Conventional Casino Games vs. CSGO-Themed Games

To better understand how these platforms differ from standard online gambling establishments, the following comparison highlights the mechanics, target market, and style of play found on CSGO gambling sites.

The Economics of Skin Trading and Withdrawal
