

A roofing system can entice even careful homeowners into false confidence. From the ground, a missing out on shingle looks workable. geometry. Another warning is a stain that grows, darkens, or leaves a faint ring each time it rains. That pattern typically indicates water is getting in frequently, not from a one-time event.

You ought to also focus on soft spots, sagging locations, or a roofline that has changed shape. Those are not cosmetic issues. They can indicate damaged decking or structural tension.
