3. The Unboxer (Proceed with Caution)

- **The Play:** Buy secrets and open every new case that drops.

While striking an unusual knife or covert skin yields an enormous dopamine hit (and monetary return), the huge majority of openings lead to low-tier, low-value weapon finishes.
