For non-EU/EEA license holders (e.g., USA, India, UK post-Brexit, Ukraine), the guidelines are stricter:

- Licenses from nations that signed the **1968 Vienna Convention on Road Traffic** can generally be exchanged straight, though tests might be required depending on bilateral contracts and residency period.
- Licenses from nations under the **1949 Geneva Convention** usually require passing the theoretical state test.
