The Float Value System

Aside from rarity, every skin is designated a **Float Value** in between 0.00 and 1.00. This float determines the wear condition of the weapon. Even two similar skins might look drastically various depending upon their float worth, which straight affects their market price.

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07 (Pristine, no scratches)
- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15 (Minor blemishes or scratches)
- **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15-- 0.38 (Noticeable wear and tear)
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45 (Significant wear on paint)
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00 (Heavily degraded, sometimes changes the look totally)

2. The Mechanics of Acquisition: How Players Get Skins

Players have a couple of distinct approaches for building their digital inventories. Some depend on large luck, while others prefer direct purchasing.



- **Random Drops:** Simply playing on authorities or neighborhood servers grants weekly care bundles containing weapon drops or graffiti.
- **Opening Cases:** Players can buy or earn weapon cases and use a matching "Key" to unlock them. This runs similarly to a lottery game, with low chances of unpacking high-tier items.
- **The Steam Community Market:** The best and most managed peer-to-peer marketplace for buying and offering skins utilizing Steam Wallet funds.
- **Third-Party Trading Sites:** External platforms enable users to purchase, offer, or trade skins for real-world currency or crypto, often with lower costs and more liquidity than Steam.
- **Trade-Up Contracts:** A feature that enables players to trade 10 skins of the exact same rarity tier for one skin of the next greater tier, offering a method to recycle unwanted items.

3. The Digital Economy: Why Do Virtual Items Cost So Much?

To outsiders, paying hundreds or thousands of dollars for a virtual knife or rifle skin seems absurd. However, the economic concepts of supply and demand heavily govern the CS: GO skin market.

Aspects Driving Value:

1. **Scarcity:** Older cases (like the *Operation Bravo Case*) are no longer dropping naturally. As more cases are opened and items are locked into dormant accounts, the supply diminishes while demand continues.

Over a years, specific weapon finishes have attained legendary status within the neighborhood.

- **AWP|Dragon Lore:** The holy grail of CS: GO skins. Sporting a mythical dragon theme, pristine Factory New versions have historically sold for 10s of countless dollars.
- **AK-47|Case Hardened (Blue Gem):** Due to the method the case-hardened pattern rolls, unusual versions include almost completely solid blue topsides, bring huge collector rates.
- **M4A4|Groan:** The only skin categorized as "Contraband." Valve removed it from drop pools due to copyright violation issues including the artwork, making existing copies immensely valuable collector's items.
- **Karambit|Doppler (Ruby/Sapphire/Emerald):** High-end knives featuring dazzling gem-like surfaces that stay status signs among experienced players.

5. The Transition to Counter-Strike 2 (CS2)

When Valve transitioned the game from CS: GO to **Counter-Strike 2**, fans held their cumulative breath concerning the fate of their stocks. Thankfully, Valve validated that **all products brought over seamlessly** into the brand-new engine.
